

Criminalization under Carol II



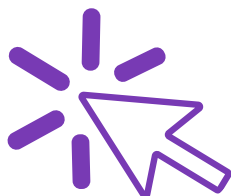
1936

The 1936 Penal Code adopted under King Carol II introduced provisions criminalizing same-sex relations when considered to cause public scandal.

The Penal Code of 1936 (often called the “Carol II Penal Code”) made consensual same-sex relations illegal when they caused “public scandal” (Art. 431), introducing criminal penalties framed as “acts of sexual inversion.”

Significance: This was a key turning point: same-sex intimacy became a matter for criminal law, laying groundwork for later communist-era intensification (including the 1968 reform that introduced Article 200).
